"I saw stalactites and stalagmites forming solemnly," added Jack.


Year 5 interviewed their peers and uncovered mixed feelings about the trip. Some thought there was so much information that we lost out on walking time; others were glad to absorb these facts!

Sadly, all trips must come to an end. However, you too could experience this unique trip, wouldn't you want to go?





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
