The plan is to fix it by repainting it, putting new wood on it and generally making it as good as new.




#### **Timber**




### It's Mrs Gallagher!

# Make Do and Mend By Charlotte 6LB

With the COP26 happening recently I decided I wanted to help the planet too and this is one way to do it.

We've been learning about World War 2 in class and in the 1940s they used to reduce, reuse and recycle things all the time. Plastic hadn't been invented and they lived much more sustainably with their motto "Make Do and Mend".

Make do and mend can really help in the fight against climate change as so much waste is discarded clothes and plastic. If we repair and look after our clothes they'll last longer and we will not throw away as much or buy new clothes all the time. Make do and mend also means that if you have an event to go to and you need a dress/suit, instead of buying something new you use what you already have and either add accessories, wear it differently or make sewing alterations.

I've noticed that year 6 hoodies easily seem to develop holes on the edge of peoples' pockets and the more they're ignored the more they'll grow

"A stitch in time, saves nine!"

These ideas will work on any type of clothing so please use them as much as you can. Plus as long as it is not on school uniform you can have any patch you like! Please note that very outgoing or garish patches are not permitted on school uniforms.

You can use the internet or the li-

brary to find out how to sew and how to darn.

What you'll need for:

Darning – darning "mushroom", a needle and thread

Patching – the patch, a needle and thread


Sewing – Just a needle and thread.

With normal jumpers or cardigans, you can use the same trick. On cardigans do not worry if the button falls off as the school has very smartly put a spare button on the inside of the cardigan, please watch a video on how to fix it and don't just throw it away and buy a new one. You can buy lots of thread and patches at many haberdasheries, there are a few in Lancaster. You can also buy many make do and mend books online and in the haberdasheries. There's no reason to throw old clothes away. If they're still in good condition, you can give them to a charity shop. If they're not in good condition any more you can reuse the fabric to make smaller clothes, dusters, polishing rags and many other uses.

Finally, on the subject of leggings and tracksuit bottoms:

They (leggings especially) get holes in quite easily, I don't recommend patching these up. There are two way of fixing these holes, if it is quite a straight hole just stitching will work, but if it's quite a round or curved hole then darning is the best bet. I hope you enjoyed reading this article and learned something from it.
