Topic	Subjects and Coverage	<p>History: Tudors and Stuarts Rebellion and Revolution Why did Henry VIII have 6 wives? Why did Henry create the Church of England? Why did the Spanish want to invade in 1588? What does the gunpowder plot tell us about the struggle between Catholics and Protestants? (<i>link back to Y2 learning</i>) Why was there a civil war in England? How did Queen Anne create the United Kingdom of Great Britain? Art: Use growing technical skill and knowledge of different drawing materials, combined with increasing confidence in making a creative response to a wide range of stimuli, to explore more experimental drawing, following child's own interests/affinities Continue to familiarize with sketchbook / drawing exercises. Describe how to undertake the ones they know as means of recap/reminder and introduce new ones, which are practiced regularly. Study the work of Holbein and Henry 8th Court – Art appreciation, discussion of portraits, looking at the use of symbolism in artwork linked to Tudors.</p>	<p>History: Lancashire Witches – Trials of 1612 What do the witch trials tell us about society in the 1600s? What did the accused do that was "witchcraft"? What probably happened to John Law? Why were they sent to Lancaster Gaol (castle)? Why is the event still remembered and important? How else were people punished and persecuted in the 1500s and 1600s and why? Geography: Map skills Children observe, measure, record and communicate geographical information of the local area. Children begin to measure simple distances between locations and begin to understand the concept of scale on maps and digital maps. Art: Self-portraits in the style of Holbein for Calendar. Foam board Christmas stars Felt Christmas trees DT Christmas makes - Sewing Christmas tree. Research, design, make and evaluate project – Witch's biscuits.</p>	<p>History: The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain Why did the Romans invade Britain? How do we know about life in Roman Britain? Who was Boudicca and why do we remember her? How did Celtic people live? Britain? Geography: Italy Children identify regions within Italy and identify and compare the location of Sicily with the location of the north-west region of the UK. Children develop their comparison skills further by comparing two contrasting regions – their home region and the region of Sicily in Italy (building on work done in year 3 on the north west). They identify and describe a range of similarities and differences in the human and physical geography of each region. Children compare and contrast the economic activity (including trade links) of the two regions. Art: Combine art forms such as collage, painting and printmaking in mixed media projects to recreate an Italian collage in the style of Henri Matisse</p>	<p>History: Why did the Romans settle in York (Eboracum)? What evidence is there in Lancaster of the Romans? Why did the Romans leave Geography: Italy – volcanos They understand what a volcano is and how geographical features like volcanoes affect where people settle. DT: Engineering week project</p>	<p>History: A study of the achievements of the earliest civilisations – a depth study: Ancient Egypt What did the Egyptians believe in and how do we know? How different were beliefs in Ancient Egypt from today? How did religion affect life in Egypt? How did civilisation adapt to the needs of Egyptian life? How important a role did the River Nile play in the lives of the Egyptians? Geography: Climate Children develop their understanding of the concept of climate. They identify the world's climate zones and locate and explain the significance of the equator, Tropic of Cancer and Tropic of Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic circle and the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere. Art: Make a figure from paper and tape and use as the basis to explore modelling with clay to make shabti. Paint final piece. Children make coil pots- an Egyptian skill. Ann Lewis – Lino prints</p>	<p>Geography: Climate Children locate the world's biomes and vegetation belts. Children describe and understand key aspects of biomes and vegetation in Egypt. Children investigate climate change. They begin to understand some of the effects that climate change can have. DT: Make a shaduf using moving parts and investigating how they work.</p>
