

Key Stage One

When children have finished the Early Years Curriculum they move to the Key Stage One Curriculum.



- Key Stage One consists of Year 1 and Year 2.
- There are two classes in each year group. Class sizes are a maximum of thirty children.
- In Year 1 children are taught key skills in smaller, focused groups of twenty. They have access to provision areas to learn through independent challenges. There are up to five adults working to support the children across the year group— two teachers and three teaching assistants.
- In the final term of Year 1, children move to the more formal learning of Year 2.
- In Year 2 children are registered in their own classes and may be taught as a class or mixed for different subjects. The year 2 team consists of two teachers and two teaching assistants to. This allows children to be taught in groups of 20, which enables staff to really focus on child development and progress across KS1.
