Reception at Bowerham




All of the Reception children at Bowerham school travelled to Lowther Castle on 18th May 2023 for a big adventure!

Lowther Castle has been occupied by the same family since 1150 when it was occupied by a descendant of a Viking settler!

It became a ruin in 1957.

blackcurrant and a pea from a pod! Everything was delicious! The children are now super keen to grow their own fruits and vegetables at home and school.



On Tuesday 27th June 2023, Year 3 had a Chocolate Day held at school in order to learn more about the Aztecs and how they used chocolate!



In the first activity, the children got to taste four different chocolates. Most of the children thought the white and milk chocolates tasted fantastic. Yosif said the chocolate milk tasted good. After this, the next challenge was to design and make chocolate boxes using 3D nets, which had to have an Aztec theme.

For the second activity, Year 3 went to the staff room and children's kitchen to make their very own delicious chocolates. This was the most exciting part! First they had to melt some of the chocolate in the microwave and choose a funky shaped mould. Then, they had the choice to add cinnamon and chilli before they poured the chocolate into the mould. After this they could add decorations like coconut or pineapple, or add different chocolate flavours.

There were multiples tasks going on at different times of the day including, taste-testing chocolates and designing chocolate packaging, making chocolates, and learning about the history of chocolate.



In the final task, the children learnt about the history of chocolate and how it is made. They got to hold a cocoa pod. Brooke thought "There's something in it because it was heavy." They were astonished when they discovered the inside was white and slimy - nothing like chocolate!

Finally, we all returned together to complete a quiz with Nefertiti.

The day was truly great and the props Nefertiti brought with her were fabulous.






