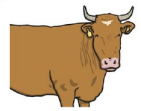
**Sight:** we see the world with our eyes.

## Animal Diets

**Herbivore:** an animal that eats natural foods, like fruit, plants, leaves, grass. Cows and mice are herbivores.

**Carnivore:** an animal that only eats meat. Tigers and snakes are carnivores.



omnivore

**Omnivore:** an animal that eats both meat and natural foods. Humans and dogs are omnivores.

## DT- where food comes from?

### Food from plants

Some foods come from plants, like fruit, rice, vegetables and soya.

## Types of Animals

**Amphibian:** An animal that can live in water and on land. They breathe through their skin and lay their eggs in water.

**Reptile:** A cold-blooded animal with scales or or plates.

**Fish:** An animal that lives in water and has fins and scales. It breathes through gills.

**Mammal:** An animal that has skin and hair or fur. They have warm blood and their babies drink milk.

**Bird:** A bird has feathers and wings. They lay eggs.



## Christianity—God as the Father

### Why do Christians call God the Father?

**God** is addressed as the **Father**, in part because of his active interest in human affairs, in the way that a **father** would take an interest in his children who are dependent on him and as a **father**, he will respond to humanity, his children, acting in their best interests.

### What lessons do we learn from The Parable of the Lost Son story?

The Father had two sons, and had an inheritance to give to them. One of the sons asked for his money. He takes his money and wastes it all away, until he left with nothing. When he returns home, his father welcomes him and throws a celebration.

We learn that, like the father in the story, **God** will always forgive us and take care of us, even when we make mistakes.
